*Governor's Proclamation*

**WHEREAS**, Missouri State Representative Thomas P. Hannegan was born on May 6, 1970, to the late John and Mary Lou Hannegan in St. Charles, Missouri; and

**WHEREAS**, Representative Hannegan attended The Academy of the Sacred Heart and graduated in 1988 from Duchesne High School. He received his Bachelor's Degree from Lindenwood College in 1992, and earned his Master's Degree in Human Resources from Lindenwood University in 1998; and

**WHEREAS**, Representative Hannegan, a Republican, was first elected to represent District 65 in the Missouri House of Representatives in November 2016. He honorably represented parts of St. Charles County and northern St. Charles; and

**WHEREAS**, Representative Hannegan served as Chairman of the Local Government Committee and a member of the following House Committees: Children and Families, Special Committee on Criminal Justice, and Joint Committee on Disaster Preparedness and Awareness; and

**WHEREAS**, Representative Hannegan worked tirelessly to pass House Bill 273, signed by Governor Michael L. Parson on June 22, 2021, which reduced occupational barriers for members of the military and opened up job opportunities for citizens to start careers in new areas; and

**WHEREAS**, in addition to his legislative duties, Representative Hannegan served as publisher and editor-in-chief of StreetScape Magazine. He was also an associate-broker with Hannegan Real Estate & Construction, LLC, a family owned business; and

**WHEREAS**, Representative Hannegan, a respected Missouri lawmaker, passed on October 20, 2021, at fifty-one years of age.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, I, Michael L. Parson, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MISSOURI, present this proclamation as a mark of respect for the death of

**STATE REPRESENTATIVE THOMAS P. HANNEGAN**


