Governor's Proclamation

WHEREAS, 2021 marks the one hundredth anniversary of the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, with a yearlong commemoration; and

WHEREAS, the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier is dedicated to deceased U.S. service members whose remains have not been identified; and

WHEREAS, the tomb is at Arlington National Cemetery in Arlington, Virginia; and

WHEREAS, on November 7, 2021, The Rachel Donelson Chapter of The National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution, will hold a program to honor and remember the Unknown Soldiers along with state and county dignitaries; and

WHEREAS, during the program, Paul Frinsthal, a Tomb Guard, from the Vietnam Era, will speak to all attendees;

WHEREAS, we all owe a great debt of gratitude to the unknown and known soldiers of our Armed Forces.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Michael L. Parson, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MISSOURI, do hereby proclaim November 7, 2021, to be

in Missouri, and ask all citizens to observe this day and recognize the importance of our soldiers.
