Governor's Proclamation

WHEREAS, our Nation's founders overcame enormous obstacles to establish a system of government unparalleled in history; and

WHEREAS, Thomas Jefferson made enormous contributions to U.S. diplomacy and we are the beneficiaries of that sacrifice, courage, and honor; and

WHEREAS, among these legendary patriots, Thomas Jefferson remains unique as the founder who articulated the essential values and principles of American liberty and freedom in the Declaration of Independence, which altered how the world viewed the relationship between government and the governed; and

WHEREAS, beyond Thomas Jefferson's achievements in public life as Governor of Virginia, author of the Statute of Virginia for Religious Freedom, Secretary of State, third President of the United States, and founder of the University of Virginia, Jefferson was a scholar, author, naturalist, inventor, bibliophile, and architect; and

WHEREAS, as President, Jefferson supported the Lewis and Clark Expedition and secured the \$15 million purchase of the Louisiana Territory, of which a portion would later be known as the State of Missouri; and

WHEREAS, as our Nation evolves, one constant reminder for future generations is Jefferson's assertion that people have "unalienable rights," including "life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness".

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Michael L. Parson, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MISSOURI, do hereby proclaim April 13, 2022, to be

JEFFERSON DAY

in Missouri.
