WHEREAS, nurse practitioners play a critical role as trusted providers of health care for patients in our state; and

WHEREAS, nurse practitioners work to expand health care access in underserved communities, promote health equity in care; and

WHEREAS, patients depend on the more than 355,000 licensed nurse practitioners in the United States, and more than 13,930 in Missouri to diagnose, manage, and treat their chronic and acute health care conditions; and

WHEREAS, nurse practitioners provide high-quality primary, acute, and specialty health care services while emphasizing health promotion, disease prevention, health education and counseling, guiding patients to make smarter health and lifestyle choices every day; and

WHEREAS, the confidence that patients have in nurse practitioner-delivered health care is evidenced by the more than one billion visits made annually to nurse practitioners across the country; and

WHEREAS, more than five decades of research confirms the high quality of care provided by nurse practitioners; and

WHEREAS, better utilization of nurse practitioners through modernized state laws and improved policies creates better health through a more accessible, efficient, cost-effective and higher-quality health care system; and

WHEREAS, Missouri is proud to recognize and honor the service of nurse practitioners to our state.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Michael L. Parson, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MISSOURI, do hereby proclaim November 13 - 19, 2022, to be
