Governor's Proclamation

WHEREAS, Missouri agriculture contributes \$93.7 billion to the state's economy and employs nearly 460,000 people; and

WHEREAS, Missouri is home to 95,000 farms, 97% of which are family owned and operated; and

WHEREAS, Missouri farmers consistently rank in the top ten nationally in commodities including soybeans, hay, beef cows, corn, broiler chickens, hogs, goats, turkeys, rice, cotton, and forest products; and

WHEREAS, Missouri farmers work every day to produce a safe and secure food supply for consumers locally and globally; and

WHEREAS, Missouri FFA and 4-H touch the lives of young men and women, building up the next generation of agricultural leaders; and

WHEREAS, Missouri is home to the largest concentration of plant scientists in the world in St. Louis and is a leader in the animal health sector in Kansas City, and is constantly making advancements to keep up with growing demand from domestic and international markets; and

WHEREAS, Missouri houses two of the largest river systems in the United States, which allow Missouri commodities to be distributed domestically and internationally; and

WHEREAS, agriculture experiences are numerous in Missouri, through farmers markets, agritourism venues, wineries, and the Missouri State Fair; and

WHEREAS, agriculture impacts the lives of all Missourians from the food they eat, the milk they drink, the fuel they pump into their vehicle, and the clothes they wear.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Michael L. Parson, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MISSOURI, do hereby proclaim March 19-25, 2023, to be

NATIONAL AGRICULTURE WEEK

in Missouri.
