

State of Missouri Governor's Proclamation

WHEREAS, 703,000 Americans died from major cardiovascular diseases in 2022, which is 1 in 5 deaths in the United States; and

WHEREAS, in Missouri, cardiovascular disease is the leading cause of death and claims nearly 15,500 lives each year; and

WHEREAS, the University of Missouri is home to three centers for cardiovascular research: the Dalton Cardiovascular Research Center, the School of Medicine, and the College of Veterinary Medicine; and

WHEREAS, scientists from the University of Missouri are renowned in such areas as the effects of exercise on the heart, hypertension, and heart failure, and these scientists are committed to the pursuit of further medical advances in the fight against cardiovascular disease; and

WHEREAS, these scientists gather each year in Columbia to share their work with fellow scientists in an event hosted by the University of Missouri, thereby bringing further scientific and medical advances closer to reality.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Michael L. Parson, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MISSOURI, do hereby proclaim March 5, 2024, to be

CARDIOVASCULAR DAY

in Missouri.
