

State of Missouri Governor's Proclamation

WHEREAS, Phylicia F. Carson entered the University of Missouri Law Enforcement Training Institute on May 15, 2023, and on September 14, 2023, graduated and was issued a Missouri Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) License; and

WHEREAS, in her application for a Missouri Blue Scholarship to attend the training institute, Phylicia F. Carson, who was 32 and the mother of six young children, wrote, "I want to know I can make a difference in the area I am raising my children. I want to show my children how to grow up and be outstanding members of society"; and

WHEREAS, Officer Carson was commissioned as a Police Officer with the Osage Beach Police Department on September 15, 2023, and honorably served the department through August 31, 2024; and

WHEREAS, early on the morning of August 31, 2024, Officer Carson was responding to assist another officer in a vehicle pursuit when her patrol vehicle ran off the road and struck a tree, killing Officer Carson; and

WHEREAS, law enforcement officers courageously and selflessly strive to ensure the safety and well-being of their fellow citizens; and

WHEREAS, the people of the State of Missouri are thankful for the brave individuals in law enforcement who consider the welfare of others a personal responsibility and work tirelessly to protect the lives and property of their fellow citizens.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Michael L. Parson, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MISSOURI, as a mark of respect for the death of

OFFICER PHYLICIA F. CARSON

and for her bravery and service to the Osage Beach Police Department do hereby order that the flag of the United States and the flag of Missouri shall be flown at half-staff at all government buildings in Camden and Miller Counties and all police stations across Missouri for one full day on September 5, 2024, from sunrise to sunset.
