

State of Missouri Governor's Proclamation

WHEREAS, Firefighter/Paramedic Kyle Robert Brinker faithfully devoted 11 years of his life to protecting the people of Kansas City as a member of the Kansas City Fire Department, spending the majority of his career at Station 35, one of the department's busiest stations; and

WHEREAS, Firefighter/Paramedic Brinker first joined the fire service as a junior firefighter with the Renton Volunteer Fire Department in Plum Borough, Pennsylvania, and advanced to Firefighter/Paramedic; and

WHEREAS, in Pennsylvania, Firefighter/Paramedic Brinker also served as an EMT and paramedic; and

WHEREAS, on September 17, 2024, while performing his duties as a Rescue Technician for the Kansas City Fire Department, Firefighter/Paramedic Brinker died in the line of duty; and

WHEREAS, emergency responders courageously and selflessly devote their lives to ensuring the safety and well-being of their fellow citizens; and

WHEREAS, the people of the State of Missouri are thankful for the sacrifices of the brave emergency responders who risk their own lives to protect the lives and property of their fellow citizens.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Michael L. Parson, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MISSOURI, as a mark of respect for the death of

FIREFIGHTER/PARAMEDIC KYLE ROBERT BRINKER

and for his bravery and service to the Kansas City Fire Department and the citizens of Cass, Clay, Platte, and Jackson counties, Missouri, do hereby order that the flag of the United States and the flag of Missouri shall be flown at half-staff at every fire station in the State of Missouri and at the Fire Fighters Memorial located in Kingdom City, Missouri, as well as at all government buildings in Jackson and Platte Counties, from sunrise until sunset on September 25, 2024.
