Proclamation

WHEREAS, former Missouri State Senator Carl M. Vogel was born in Jefferson City, Missouri, on March 7, 1955, and was a lifelong resident of Jefferson City. After graduating from Helias High School and from the University of Missouri – Columbia, he began working as the fourth generation in the family business, Jefferson City Coca-Cola Bottling Company, and was named president of the company in 1983; and

WHEREAS, in 1979, Carl M. Vogel married Kimberly L. Grice, and together, they had two children, Jacob (Jake) and Kristen; and

WHEREAS, from a young age until his passing, Carl M. Vogel was a leader in community volunteer service in Jefferson City. Under his leadership, Coca-Cola was committed to using its resources to help with numerous fundraising activities over the years. In addition, at the time of his death, he was serving or had served on the boards of the American Red Cross Central and Northern Chapter, the Jefferson City YMCA, St. Mary's Health Center and the St. Mary's Foundation, the Helias Foundation, the Host Lions Club, the Jefferson City Crime Stoppers, the Adult Basic Literacy Education program, and the Great Rivers Council for the Boy Scouts, among other organizations; and

WHEREAS, Carl M. Vogel was recognized several times for his community service, including receiving the Bill Quigg Distinguished Service Award from the Jefferson City Chamber of Commerce; and being named as one of Ten Outstanding Missourians by the Missouri Jaycees; and

WHEREAS, Carl M. Vogel began his public service to the citizens of Missouri when he was elected to the Missouri House of Representatives in 1990, and was subsequently re-elected to the House for a total of six terms. In 2002, he was elected to the Missouri Senate to serve the people of central Missouri, and was re-elected in 2006 before stepping down because of term limits in 2010. In the Senate, he was Chairman of the Ways and Means Committee. As a legislator, he was particularly committed to fiscal responsibility, public education, and the needs of his constituents, many of whom were state employees; and

WHEREAS, Carl M. Vogel passed away on April 14, 2016.




SENATOR CARL M. VOGEL
